ASU Assistant Professor Miki Aoki performs works for solo piano on the cathedral's splendid Bösendorfer piano. A frequent guest artist in prestigious concert series and festivals around the world, Ms. Aoki made her debut at the age of 12 at the Royal Festival Hall in London's South Bank Centre as a soloist with the National Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Aoki will present music by Robert Schumann, Johannes Brahms, Luciano Berio, Max Richter, and Leoš Janáček.

Music at Trinity heads into its second decade of the Peel Memorial Organ concert with Adam Brakel, Director of Music at St. James Cathedral and the Diocese of Orlando, Florida. National Public Radio hailed him as “an absolute organ prodigy with the technique and virtuosity that most concert pianists could only dream of...he is the Franz Liszt of the organ.” Mr. Brakel will perform music of Vierne, Bach, Saint- Martin, Dupré, and Meyerbeer on the cathedral's IV/71 Schantz organ.

The spring program features a variety of works for strings and winds, including a Quintet by 18th century Austrian composer Franz Xaver Süssmayr, and *7 Dances for Flute, Clarinet and Cello* by composer Brian Raphael Nabors. The second part of the concert

includes Schubert's thrillingly sinister Lied "Der Erlkönig", *Sonatine Modale for Flute and Clarinet* by French composer Charles Koechlin, and *String Trio No. 1 in A Minor* by Post-romantic German composer Max Reger.
